Profile; Naracoorte, South Australia

Our good friends and business partners, MINIJUMBUK, began their operation 35 years ago and continue to manufacture in Naracoorte in South Australia. Having this strong connection to this part of the world, we felt it appropriate to run a profile of the town, so the next time it comes up in conversation, you are better informed.

Naracoorte is in the heart of the Limestone Coast region, neighbouring Horsham, Mount Gambier and Bordertown, just over the border with Victoria, in South Australia. A 5 hour drive from Melbourne or 3 hour drive from Adelaide and a good stopover point for those heading from Adelaide to Robe, Naracoorte is famous for its world heritage listed caves and as a central point to the famous Pathaway, Wrattobully and Coonawarra wine regions.

Unlike a lot of towns in rural Australia, Naracoorte has thrived and become quite self-sufficient with some very successful businesses in the area, (including 'award-winning' Minijumbuk of course). There is a real sense of community amongst its residents and their pride in the town is reflected in its obvious cleanliness, which previously achieved them the 'Australia's tidiest town' accolade in 1995.

Naracoorte has several attractions, including the Minijumbuk centre, where you can view the manufacturing operation and visit the factory shop. There is also the Sheep's Back Wool Museum, parks and walks in all directions and a swimming lake, where families and visitors spend time during hot summer days.
